

ESLA Student Vacation/Leave of Absence Policy

In order to be eligible for a vacation, students need to be in good academic standing. Our vacation policy allows students to take a break without the missed days of the designated vacation period being counted as absences. To be eligible, a student must receive approval from the administration.

Eligibility Requirements include:

- 1. Students completing two quarters are eligible for a one month vacation except during the week of the midterms or finals. If a student decides not to take any time off after the completion of two consecutive quarters, he/she would be eligible to take a quarter (three months) off upon the completion of four quarters (12 months).
- 2. In emergency situations, such as serious illness or a death in the immediate family, students will be allowed to take a leave of absence not to extend beyond 50% of the length of period for which the student applied, unless otherwise stipulated and documented.

Prior to beginning a Vacation, a qualifying Student must fulfill the following requirements:

- 1. Good academic standing and maintaining a cumulative 70% or higher
- 2. Maintained valid F-1 status, per ESLA's satisfactory academic progress policy and United States Customs & Immigration Service (USCIS) policies.
- 3. Fulfill all outstanding financial obligations
- 4. Submit, in writing, a formal notification of intent to take Vacation one week before the end of the session.

The request must include:

- 1. Intended begin and end dates for the Vacation (including next intended Enrollment date)
- 2. General plans (i.e. travel domestically and/or internationally, etc.)
- 3. F-1 Students who qualify for a vacation must pay a Registration Fee before their I-20 can be registered for the vacation semester. Failure to remit the registration fee will result in Termination of the Student's F-1 record.

Additional Criteria:

- Students are encouraged to utilize the breaks at the conclusion of each quarter for travel. Although, vacations during the middle of a quarter are discouraged, ESLA is aware that situations may arise that necessitate time off. If a leave of absence is granted to a student after the start of a quarter, the student is responsible for making up assignments and exams.
- 2. A minimum score of 70% must be attained on the Final Exam in order for the student to progress to the next level of instruction.
- 3. Students returning from a vacation/leave of absence exceeding eight weeks in duration may be required to retake the placement test.

Failure to satisfy the requirements of this policy will result in Termination of the Student's USCIS record.
